



MAS 201

The MAS 201 Camp is our second-year course for students who have completed MAS 101 or 100MC. The program has been designed to provide a well-rounded outdoor educational experience to complete Phys. Ed. 20/30 and select Career and Technology Studies (CTS) courses.

MAS 201 consists of 14 days at the HeLa Ventures field school, where students will participate in a variety of activities including (but not limited to):

- lake canoeing
- river canoeing
- hiking
- rock climbing & top rope set-up
- trail biking
- orienteering
- wilderness living skills/bushcraft,
- 4 day camping trip
- gymnastics
- dance
- various games.

201 also includes coursework surrounding leadership and risk management, with the opportunity to achieve a Standard First Aid certification. The trip will culminate in a 4 day dryland camping trip. MAS 201 provides skills and certifications that are valuable to those looking for future summer work in an outdoor environment.

**Please note: for those who have not taken MAS 100/101, we have designed MAS 202 which allows students to enter the MAS stream in Grade 11. For further details please see the MAS 202 program package.*

Phys. Ed. 20/30

Phys. Ed. 20/30 are required courses for some post-secondary institutions/faculties as a prerequisite to study. The course is 5 credits and consists of 7 Modules. For MAS 201, Modules 1 and 7 will be completed by students online as a pre-course package. The remainder of the course will be completed at camp.

HCS 2020: Intermediate First Aid

HCS 2020 provides a nationally recognized Intermediate First Aid with CPR and AED certification. Students will utilize these concepts as they analyze risk in their outdoor activities. Intermediate First Aid is a required certification for many employment positions.

WLD 1910: Paddle Canada Lake Skills

WLD 1910 is a project based CTS credit that connects WLD 1130 (MAS 101) with HSS 1080 to practice leadership skills in outdoor pursuits. The Paddle Canada Intro Lake Skills is the foundational course to all flatwater canoeing skills and instructor courses.

WLD 2130: Outdoor Excursions

Students will build on skills achieved in WLD 1130 to plan and implement an outdoor excursion. Students will participate in the theoretical components of program planning while assisting their guides in organizing their camping trip.

HSS 1080: Leadership Foundations 1

HSS 1080 is a foundational leadership course that highlights various forms of leadership and relevant skills. Students will begin to explore their own potential as leaders while ensuring their and others' well-being in the outdoors.

WLD 2910: Intermediate Project - Top Rope Site Management

WLD 2910 builds on concepts from leadership and introductory survival skills to achieve knowledge and skill in setting up and managing a top rope site. Students will have the opportunity to set up a site, climb, and belay under close

HSS 1080 is a foundational leadership course that highlights various forms of leadership and relevant skills. Students will begin to explore their own potential as leaders while ensuring their and others' well-being in the outdoors.

WLD 2910: Intermediate Project: Top Rope Site Management clinic

WLD 2910 builds on concepts from Leadership and introductory survival skills to achieve knowledge and skill in setting up and managing a top rope site. Students will have the opportunity to set up a site, climb, and belay under close supervision. The focus of the course will be on risk assessment and management.
