**Students MUST be enrolled in credit courses in order to participate in the camp.*

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MAS 100 SERIES

MAS 101

HELA VENTURES FIELD SCHOOL CAMP

MAS 101 consists of 13 days of experiential learning in the outdoors, based out of the HeLa Ventures Field School.

Credits offered:

- Physical Education 10 (5 credits)
- TOU 1010 (The Tourism Industry, 1 credit)
- WLD 1130 (Outdoor Survival, 1 credit)
- CALM 20 (online, 3 credits)

Prerequisite:

- Grade 9



MAS 102

IN-CITY DAY CAMP

MAS 102 (previously known as MAS 100) consists of 5 days (approximately 9:00AM - 4:00PM) located in Edmonton.

Credits offered:

- Phys. Ed. 10 (5 credits)

Students may choose to complete this program independently or in combination with online CALM 20 and/or MAS 102MC (Mountain Camp).

Prerequisite:

- Grade 9

MAS 102 MC

MOUNTAIN CAMP

MAS 102MC is a 5-day camp stationed at HeLa Ventures Field School. *Mountain Camp is only available to those who have completed MAS 102.

Credits offered:

- TOU 1010 (The Tourism Industry; 1 credit)
- WLD 1130 (Outdoor Survival; 1 credit)

Prerequisite:

- MAS 102 (In-City Day Camp)

MAS CALM 20

MAS CALM 20 (3 credits) is offered as a fully online, asynchronous, standalone course that can be completed in conjunction with any of our programs. This course is required for high school graduation.



MAS 200 SERIES

MAS 200 offers two options: MAS 201 for those who have completed MAS 101 or MAS 102MC (previously MAS 100MC); and MAS 202 for those who are new to MAS or have completed MAS 102 (previously MAS 100). Both streams provide a 14 day camp at our Field School location, HeLa Ventures. *Each MAS 200 group contains both MAS 201 and 202 students.

MAS 300 SERIES

This year, MAS 301 is offered in 2 separate streams within the same 14-day camp: 301A will include Phys. Ed 30, while 301B will include 5 tourism credits. This split is to provide alternative credits for students that have already completed PE30, or provide the foundation for students who are interested in the recreation or tourism industry.

301A credits offered:

MAS 400 SERIES

MAS 400 is the final program of the MAS Series. The program offers 3 potential options: 401, 401 practicum (Guide-in-Training), and/or 450.

MAS 401 WAFA + ONSITE TRAINING

MAS 401 is a 5-day camp stationed at HeLa Ventures Field School. Students will participate in a 40hr Wilderness Advanced First Aid course and 1 day of onsite mentorship.

Credits offered:

- HCS 3020 (Advanced Wilderness First Aid, 1 credit)
- HSS 1010 (Introduction to Health and Wellness, 1 credit)*
- HCS 3000 (Workplace Safety Systems, 1 credit)*

*Completed partially or fully online with guidance and review while at camp.

Prerequisite:

- MAS 300

MAS 401 PRACTICUM WORK EXPERIENCE ADD-ON

MAS 401 practicum students will add on a work experience component (Guide-in-Training), after completing the initial training from MAS 401. *MAS 401 practicum is an add-on only available for those who have completed MAS 401 (WAFA + onsite training).

401 Practicum credits offered:

- Work Experience (3 credits)
- TOU 1010 (The Tourism Industry, 1 credit)*
- TOU 1120 (Adventure and Ecotourism, 1 credit)*

*Completed partially or fully online with guidance and review while at camp.

Participants wishing to complete the work experience component must submit an application. Those selected will participate in an interview, then, if accepted into the program, arrange practicum dates and components with HeLa.

MAS 450

REMOTE RIVER TRIP

MAS 450 IS BACK! We are excited to announce that we are again offering MAS 450 to past MAS 300 graduates and alumni. The program is designed to be a capstone project for the student's past credits in leadership, canoeing, and excursions.

This year, MAS 450 will be 3 days of planning and preparation, 2 days of travel and 6 days trip on the Kootenay River, from McLeod Meadows to Canal Flats. The river is Grade 2, with Class 2 – 3 rapids.

Credits offered:

- 4 CTS High School Credits. These credits will be individually designed based on the needs of the students.

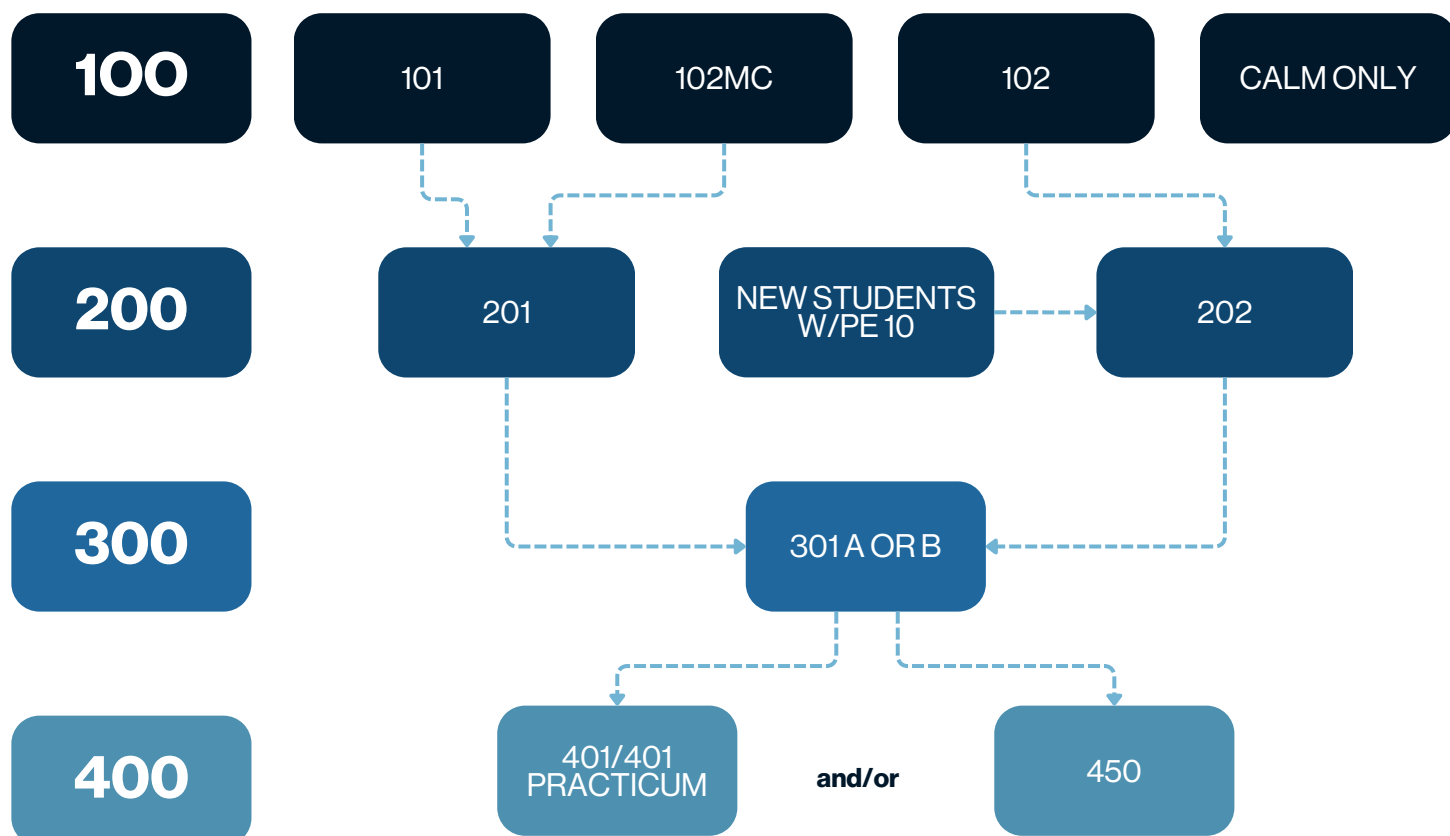
Students must apply and complete an interview process in order to participate in the program.
